#### COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course explores the shaping of Canadian Jewish literture as a response to contemporary Jewish experience. We shall focus on literary representations of the immigrant experience in Canada, the tragedy of the Holocaust, and the establishment of the Jewish State. The emphasis on literary-historical inter-relationships aims at clarification of issues which currently pre-occupy Jews and non-Jews alike.

Second Term: 1 essay (30%), 1 presentation (15%).

Short Essays: 1,500 - 2,000 words (6-8 typed pages, double

spaced).

spaced).
